Outline your Personal Statement

Use PhDPlus resources for GRFP Personal, Relevant Background, and Future Goals Statement

- **List your previous experiences; think about the following questions:**
 - How do your past, present, and future demonstrate your intellectual merit & broader impacts?
 - Motivation for a research-based graduate degree
 - Provide concrete evidence!
 - Experiences translating science/STEM outside of academia
 - Especially ones broadening participation in STEM
 - What can you do in the future?
 - Experiences that demonstrate your ability and desire to do research
 - Intellectual and Career Goals
 - How have your experiences shaped these goals?
 - · How will the GRFP benefit your career?
- List all your honors, awards, fellowships, publications, presentations, etc.

 These can be mentioned/cited in your personal statement or listed in the Fastlane application

Outline your Research Plan

Use PhDPlus resources for GRFP Graduate Research Plan Statement

- _ Consider the following questions:
 - What motivates the project?
 - Big picture why is this important?
 - How will you do the project?
 - Methods
 - Resources
 - Alternative approaches
 - What will the outcome mean to your field?
 - Feasible research plan that will generate knowledge
 - Cite/acknowledge what is known (or state of field)
 - Describe how your work will expand existing knowledge
- __ Talk through your research plan with your advisor and lab colleagues

__ Choose your <u>reference letter</u> writers

- e.g. current research advisor, undergraduate research advisor, volunteer supervisor
- Need at least 3 (but up to 5 letters can be submitted)

Contact and have a conversation with each letter writer:

- Provide your CV/resume
- Let them know the deadline (October 30 at 4pm)
- Say you will send essay drafts by end of September
- Give them suggestions of what to include in their letter (intellectual merit, broader impacts)
